Some of these talks are being graciously hosted for free by event partners and venues around Bath. We are grateful to them from the bottom of our hearts for helping us to expand what we can offer to our guests, particularly those who (like Sir Walter Elliot) are going to Bath on a budget!







Getting around Bath



Bath has three different Park and Ride car parks out of town: Lansdown, Odd Down & Newbridge. All have ample parking spaces, including disabled bays and electric charging points, and are a 15-minute bus journey into the centre of town. Lansdown Park & Ride brings you the closest to the Jane Austen Centre.

There are various short-stay & long-stay car parks in Bath city centre. Charlotte Street car park is long-stay, and the closest to the Jane Austen Centre.

Bath Spa is the main city-centre train station for Bath. It is a 15-minute walk from the Jane Austen Centre, which is nearer to the top of town.

Bath has numerous bus routes around the City, connecting Bath locations & the wider North East Somerset area. Bath Bus Station is located next to the train station at the bottom of the city centre, approximately a 15-minutes walk from the Jane Austen Centre.

Walking in Bath

Most events are within a 15-minutes walk of the Jane Austen Centre, if they are not it is noted on the event description.

Each ticket confirmation email will contain a direct What3Words link which will take you to to venue location or meeting point for that event. If you are new to Bath we recommend downloading the What3Words app to enable you to navigate using those ticket confirmation links.

Bath, being the beautiful stone city it is, has unpredictable phone signal, so it is also highly recommended to download an offline map of Bath from Google maps.




